Objective:

Rural students, most of them studied in govt. Marathi medium, feel inhibited while doing the necessary daily English conversation. They also falter in using correct expressions in written in written English. They have a kind of fear, while writing or speaking English, because of the lack of sufficient drill of the communicative sentence patterns and meagre amount of vocabulary. This course was aimed at ousting that fear, and refresh them of the basic sentence patterns, needed for the daily use of English, whether written or spoken


Outcome:


The students enjoyed the course, while at the same time re-inventing the use of the English words, phrases and sentence patters like, the use of tense, conditional sentences, Auxiliaries etc. Many of them asked spontaneous questions, cleared their doubts and said that they were extremely inspired to improve their use of English, after this course.

113 students appeared in the online final test of this course, 69 passed scoring above 14 marks, and 53 students offered their feedback online.
